

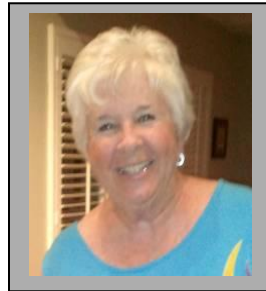

## **Mary & The Rosary**

It feels like the year just started and here we are beginning October, the month dedicated to the most holy rosary. This affords us the opportunity to look to Mary, Jesus' disciple, again. Some of her first recorded words are "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word". This provided a pattern of prayer and a way to live for her and, indeed, for each one of us.

Our lives, with all the blessings and all the pain, can be packed with meaning and purpose, if we respond with the same kind of voluntary surrender that Mary did.

That pattern of prayer was the pattern for Mary's entire life. She continues, in her place with the saints, to invite us to follow her Son. Mary lived a life of surrendered love and so it can be with us. It all begins with God's gift and invitation, invites our response, and is intended to bear the fruit of a meaningful life.

Mary brought forth the word of God. This is the prototype of the vocation of every human person. It touches the inner core of the meaning of life for all of us. We are made to give ourselves away to The Lord, and in Him, for

He recently returned from Brazil where he accompanied 40 young people to World Youth Day in Rio de Janeiro with a side trip to Sao Paulo. Some 800 young adults from our diocese were on the beach at Copacabana for the closing Mass (along with 3 million others.)

Armando described it as a missionary experience, as often, they did not know where they were staying, eating or if they'd ever have a hot shower, but they were "showered" with hospitality-a mattress on the floor, or bread and coffee to start their day. They soon got comfortable with the uncomfortable.

In an effort to see Pope Francis close up they always looked for babies hoping the pontiff might stop to kiss one of the little ones. In an effort to get the "best picture" it was difficult to resist the temptation to lift one's camera or phone instead of just enjoying being in the moment.
