



Save the Date August 8, 2015

Pope Francis has done it again. He not only speaks of dialog within the Church and with all people living in the world, he initiates it, and in a faith-filled document. *Laudato Si'*, The first Encyclical of Pope Francis invites and challenges every person in the world to become part of a community of concern. All reputable scientists publishing are emphasizing the seriousness of the degradation of our earth’s atmosphere, waters, land masses. People looking at their neighborhoods, travelling to work and to visit friends by auto, plane, ship--all see the same vulnerability which our earth is experiencing and the threat to quality of life for all living creatures, from the infinitely tiny ones to the massive trees, ocean animals, coral reefs and tropical forests.

This Encyclical takes its name from the opening lines of St. Francis of Assisi’s praise of God for creation. Francis, reminding readers that he has invoked the memory of St. Francis of Assisi for a guide for himself, the Bishop of Rome, and for the entire Catholic community in union with him. He connects his hope and vision for a concerted human effort to protect and support all of nature with the call for attention by Bishops and Catholic Conferences all over the globe, with religious leaders of every form of Christianity, every form of Biblical heritage, every expression of human love and admiration of God.

At the Diocesan Forum on the Encyclical, which will take place at the Christ Cathedral grounds on Saturday, August 8, 2015 from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. No admission will be charged, but there will be an opportunity to contribute to the cost of providing the event if you are inclined. Watch for Diocesan flyers describing the event as a whole. At this point, I want to clarify that I will be giving the presentation on the Theological foundations of Pope Francis’ encyclical *Laudato Si'*. Pope Francis is calling upon each of us to sharpen our awareness of all of creation as an expression to every living being of “the caress of God”, of the gift of beauty, of life, of hope in a future on this planet which will bring greater unity and joy to all of God’s creation--those beings which are conscious and those which are not.
