### Club News



Speaking at our meeting on August 4 was Linh Tran, the administrator for the Orange County Human Trafficking Task Force. Linh has been in this position for the last five years. Prior to assuming this position, she worked in the field of education of human trafficking problems in three other countries. She related how she met the founder of an organization who had been working with trafficking issues in Southeast Asia for the last 20 years. Working with a local priest, he started his work by feeding and housing many of the street kids. In the process, he observed many of the young girls going into a hotel with an older foreign man. He was shocked at what he observed. After speaking with the locals, they likewise observed this as well but no one seemed to say anything. That is how this French person who had simply come to visit the country started his work in trafficking issues.

When Linh returned to the US, she learned about the task force here in Orange County. By the way, the Sisters of St. Joseph were one of the original members of the task force. They provided housing for foreign national victims of sex trafficking. Linh shared various charts and graphs illuminating how widespread trafficking is in countries around the world. In her words, no country is immune to this problem. Estimates are that there are 30 million enslaved worldwide, with 60,000 here in the United States alone. In 2012, California identified almost 1300 victims of labor and sex trafficking. It is also estimated that there are global profits of \$150 billion annually in human trafficking. Two-thirds of the profits of human trafficking are sex trafficking victims.

Here in Orange County most of the victims of labor trafficking are domestic servants. It is estimated that owners save \$8 billion annually by enslaving a servant in their home. The first case locally that brought this issue to light was a sweatshop case in El Monte in 1998. Undocumented Thai workers were being held inside a factory. The doors were locked and the windows were barred. Eventually, one of the male victims escaped and sought refuge in a local church. This particular case brought about the passage of the Trafficking Victims Protection Act in 2000. It recognized that slavery still exists in this country.

Human trafficking is the umbrella for both labor and sex trafficking. In order to be considered a trafficking case, three elements are necessary. They are force, fraud and coercion. The passage of Proposition 35 in 2012 greatly increased the penalties for trafficking crimes. To date, the Orange County DA has successfully prosecuted two trafficking cases where the perpetrators received life sentences. Orange County is considered a destination county for sex trafficking, because it is so profitable for the perpetrators. The Anaheim Police Dept. is the lead agency on the task force, assuming a proactive approach to trafficking issues. They focused primarily on American victims. From July, 2011 to June, 2013, the task force has assisted 253 victims, 76% of whom were for sex trafficking. In closing, Linh told us that many of the victims are resilient. They want a better future. She encouraged us to speak with our children and grandchildren about internet safety issues.

## Club News

On August 18<sup>th</sup>, Betty Padilla was our speaker and her topic was "The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary". Following Patty Baer's warm introduction, Betty Padilla, who Patty recalls was always such a friendly member of her parish and of Serra, requested that Fr. Felix correct her if there were any inaccuracies in her presentation. The Assumption of the BVM is a very special feast day to many Catholics as the day that Our Lady was taken up into Heaven. The importance of Mary is vital, in that, her role in History is unique. She is the daughter of God the Father, the mother of Jesus Christ the Son, and the spouse of the Holy Spirit. She was the first disciple to accept Jesus and she remained close to Him throughout her entire life. She encouraged his first miracle. She shares in the Glory of Jesus Christ in Heaven. The Feast of the Assumption has a double objective: It is the major Feast celebrating Mary and her assumption body and soul into heaven; the conception of Mary without Original Sin and the conception of Jesus through the Holy Spirit.


Pope Pius XII, in 1950, declared it as dogma that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven. Pope Pius XII made it very clear that Jesus' Ascension was very different, in that he rose into Heaven of his own power, whereas Mary was assumed by God's power into Heaven. There are differing opinions surrounding where the Assumption may have taken place, some scholars state that it was Ephesus, and some indicate that it was from Jerusalem that she was assumed. The Feast of the Assumption is a very solemn and holy day on the Catholic calendar. Many church buildings reflect the name of the Assumption of the BVM.

We look to Mary as our intercessor to God and Jesus. This is very sound from the historically biblical point of view that kings of Israel would have the king's mother as a person that the people would approach to have the "ear of the king", and the influence that might afford, rather than the king's wives. Betty concluded with a beautiful reflection from Pope Benedict surrounding Mary as an example to us of the promise of Heaven that Jesus offers to each of us.

The forum was very informative and called for all to "be in love with what God as made". This leads to a call for action on our part to be collaborators with God in the care of our world. We must step up, each one of us as stewards of the world that God has dominion over. CRS has a motto: Pray, Learn, Act and Give!"
