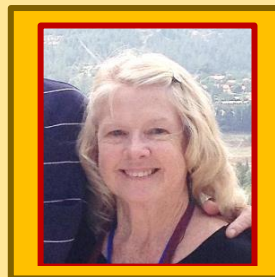

ST. FRANCIS' PRAYER FOR PEACE

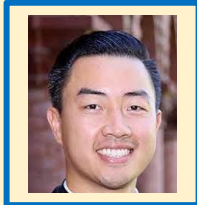
Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:

and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

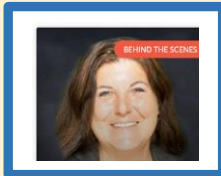
